Town Council Meeting News

December 14th - Agenda and YouTube Video

We had one Council meeting this month in an effort to wind business matters down as the holiday season approached. Our December 14th meeting began with a presentation of the Town's Financial Statements for the 2021 Fiscal year by Ms. April Adams, CPA Partner, with Audit Services of Cherry Bekaert LLP.

This report is issued to inform residents of the Town's financial condition as of June 30, 2021 and how financial resources were used this past fiscal year. The Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) awarded a Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting to the Town of Apex for this financial report. This was the 27th consecutive year that the Town has received this prestigious award! Kudos to our Finance and Accounting teams for the outstanding work that they do for us.

Our Consent Agenda for this meeting included motions for setting public hearings at our next meeting scheduled for January 11th, 2022. Additionally, we approved 3 firefighter positions as well as the revisions to the Town's Personnel Policies to reflect the same protected classes as covered under the Town's adopted Non-Discrimination Ordinance.

After our business items concluded, Mayor Pro Tem Dozier was recognized for her 8 years of service on the Council. She did not seek re-election during this past election cycle.

The regular meeting was then adjourned and the Organizational Meeting was reconvened. At this time, Council Members Killingsworth and Gantt were sworn in after their recent re-election to the Town Council. Ed Gray, who was elected to the seat vacated by Mayor Pro Tem Dozier, was then sworn in to his seat as Council Member.

Council Member Killingsworth was subsequently nominated and voted in to be the next Mayor Pro Tem. We approved our meeting schedule for the coming year, which will be the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month, with meetings beginning at 6 pm. Mayor Gilbert then appointed Council Members to serve on various committees. I will be serving on the Economic Development Committee and will also be the Council liaison to the Environmental Advisory Board. Before the meeting was adjourned, Town Clerk Donna Hosch was also recognized for her retirement and years of service.

On December 3rd, we had a lovely evening in downtown with our Christmas tree lighting!

Thanks to the Apex Rotary Club for organizing another fun Christmas parade in downtown on December 4th!


